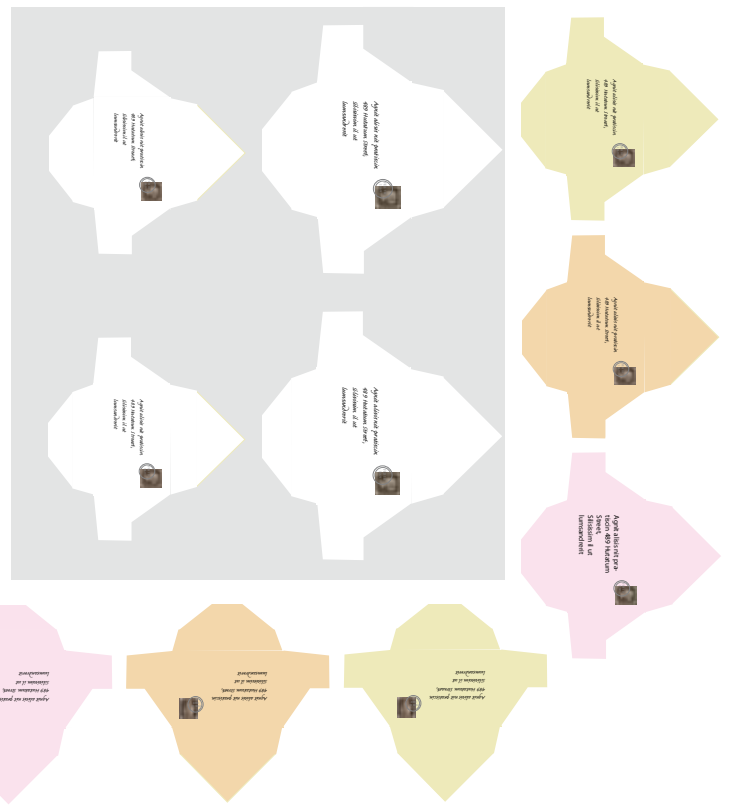

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**MAKING UP - HINTS & TIPS**

**ENVELOPES:** Carefully cut out and fold in all of the flaps to the centre - fold the sides in first then the bottom and put a spot of glue under the bottom flap to glue it to the sides. This will make an opened envelope, you can slot a folded letter in to it (if you haven't glued the flaps to the inside of it!) Glue down the top flap for an unopened letter.

**LETTERS:** Fold them into half or thirds to look like they have just come out of the envelope, or leave flat and place on a desk as if they are being written.

**PHOTOS AND GREETINGS CARDS:** These work best if printed on photo glossy paper - the key thing for the cards is to get the folds neat - try running the reverse of a craft knife (not the cutting edge!) along the folds first before creasing them.

**VISITING CARDS:** These look great on a desk or hall stand on a silver tray. They were handed in by visitors to be presented to the house owner before being admitted!

**POSTCARDS:** Like the photos and greetings cards these work best if printed on glossy photo paper - there are two options the picture side and the written side.

**NEWS/MAGAZINE:** Cut out and fold in half - for a more realistic look glue the folded interior pages inside the centre-fold of the cover.

**PLAYING CARDS:** Not full pack, but enough to make a game up on a card table! Have some face up and some back up to look more realistic - best printed on glossy photo paper.

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
